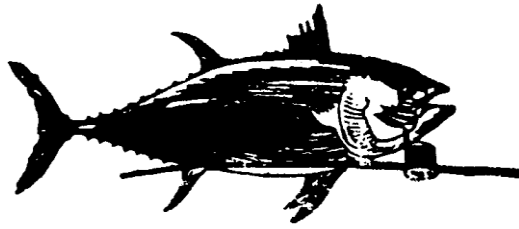

Committee News : –

The Simrad / Navico / Meridian 14th Tom Jenkins Memorial Bluefin Tuna Contest is being conducted at Eaglehawk Neck by the Tuna Club of Tasmania on Thurs the 24th , Fri 25th and Sat 26th of April 2025. The compulsory briefing where a minimum of 1 representative of each team must be present is on Wednesday evening the 23rd of April .

Entries will be accepted up until the C.O.B (approx. 5pm) on Monday 14th of April 2025. Late entries may be accepted after this date and only if less than 50 boats are entered. In view of this we encourage everyone to have their entries in and paid before the cut-off date.

The contest dinner to be held at Lufra Hotel on Saturday evening has a venue maximum seating capacity of 180 persons. A cut off on guests will be applied on a first entered basis.

Membership Subs :-

The Committee would like to remind all Members that subs for the 2024 / 2025 Season are now well over due, Membership for the 2023 / 2024 Season expired on the 30th June, 2024, Any Member wishing to take part in Rallies and Comps for the 2024 / 2025 Season should make sure they pay their Membership Subs. There is a Membership form included in this edition of “ *Southern Blues* “ or a Membership form can be obtained at www.tunacluboftasmania.asn.au.

Radio Skeds :-

Just a reminder to all Members fishing Rallies & Contests, they are to log on with Tuna Base VHF Channel 73 at or before 07:00 hours and give the name of their vessel and number of person's that are aboard, (i.e. , Tuna Base this is “ Heat Seeker “ we are fishing today with 3 adults aboard) . Then at 10 past the hour, every hour until the end of fishing, Tuna Base or Tas Maritime Radio will call up to get a position to be given from the Club grid map (i.e. , Tuna Base this is “ Heat Seeker “ I am at Kilo – 14 , with 1 Mako Captured & 2 Mako Tagged and Released). When you have finished fishing for the day , please remember to log off with Tuna Base. A lot of time and effort could be wasted looking for a vessel that is sitting on its trailer in the car park that has forgot to log off.

Vessel Detail Forms :-

All new Members and any existing Members who have changed or upgraded their Vessels or Trailers should fill out a Vessel detail form and lodge it with the Club. Details of Members Vessels are kept on file in the Radio Room so that if an emergency arises, Tuna Base can supply full details of any missing Vessel to the Rescue parties. A Vessel detail form is enclosed in this edition of “ *Southern Blues* “ .

Weighing of Fish :-

The 2024 / 2025 Committee will take on the task of Weighmaster for the game fishing season. During Weigh in, the Weighmaster will ask Anglers to produce any tackle or items of equipment used in the Capture of the fish, to ensure they comply with regulations stipulated by I.G.F.A and G.F.A.A . All fish are to be Weighed in within 1 ½ hours after the close of fishing, boats unable to meet this deadline should inform Tuna Base at the final Radio sked .

And please be mindful not to dump the fish frames or offal in and around any bays, ramps or waterways close into shore. Please take the time and make an effort to go back out around the corner and dump any frames or offal out where it cannot wash back up onto the beach or ramp.

Club Fishing Rules

The Tuna Club of Tasmania fishes under rules laid down by the I.G.F.A. , G.F.A.A. and the T.G.F.A. anglers should make themselves aware of these rules. The rules are laid out in the annual G.F.A.A. journal mailed out to members each year. Only fish captured under these rules shall be eligible for prizes.

In conjunction with these rules, the following club rules shall apply :

For the shark rallies and all other rallies :

1. The maximum number of southern bluefin tuna to be captured per day shall be four per boat.
2. All tuna and sharks may be weighed in whole for point score. Fish which are weighed gilled and gutted or cleaned sashimi style are still eligible for weighing, however only the recorded weight shall be used for scoring purposes. No additional values will be added to the weight and score of a cleaned fish. Any fish which may qualify for a record should be weighed whole , where possible. After weighing all fish are to be cleaned at sea. Under no circumstances should fish be cleaned, or frames and offal be left lying around the club complex, jetty or foreshore areas. We are located in a major tourist area and within a national park.
3. Fishing times for summer rallies (November to March) is between the hours of 7:00am to 4:00pm
Fishing times for winter rallies (April to June) is between the hours of 7:00am to 3:00pm
No lines are to be put in the water before the official start of fishing. All lines are to be wound in at the official end of fishing. No berleying for sharks to commence before the official start of fishing.
4. All boats are required to make radio contact with tuna base when they commence fishing, and then at each radio sked conducted at 10 minutes past the hour, giving their location as a grid map reference, number and type of fish aboard, and number of fish tagged and released. Boats should make every endeavour to contact tuna base each sked by relaying information through another boat. tuna base operates on VHF73 and is assisted by Tas Maritime Radio . Any boat hooked up to a fish at the end of fishing must advice base immediately.
5. The weight ticket shall be completed with all details and signed by a member of the fishing team and the weighmaster. The ticket should be then deposited in the box provided in the weigh station.
Incomplete tickets may not be considered for scoring.
To be eligible for scoring tag cards must be completed by the angler and returned to the weighmaster or tag and release coordinator by no later than the 14th day of each Month, so for example any fished tagged in January must have the cards filled out and returned by no later than the 14th February, and so on and so forth.
In the event of a tie, a count back using time of each fish tagged and released will be used to choose a winner.
Incomplete tag cards may not be considered for scoring.
6. There will be awards for the following captures in the shark rallies :
 - * Heaviest shark by an adult male angler
 - * Heaviest shark by an adult female angler
 - * Heaviest shark by a junior angler
 - * Heaviest shark by a small fry angler
 - * Highest point score shark (tuna will not accumulate points)
 - * Highest individual tag and release point score adult male angler (sharks only)
 - * Highest individual tag and release point score adult female angler (sharks only)
 - * Highest individual tag and release point score junior angler (sharks only)
 - * Highest individual tag and release point score small fry angler (sharks only)
 - * Heaviest tuna
 - * *all awards are on the basis of one fish , one prize*

7. There will be awards for the following captures in all other rallies :

- * Heaviest tuna by an adult male angler
- * Heaviest tuna by an adult female angler
- * Heaviest tuna by a junior angler
- * Heaviest tuna by a small fry angler
- * Highest point score tuna (sharks will not accumulate points)
- * Highest individual tag and release point score angler (tuna 1.5 metres or greater)
- * Highest individual tag and release point score adult male angler (tuna only)
- * Highest individual tag and release point score adult female angler (tuna only)
- * Highest individual tag and release point score junior angler (tuna only)
- * Highest individual tag and release point score small fry angler (tuna only)
- * Heaviest shark
- * *all awards are on the basis of one fish , one prize*

8. The club has imposed a minimum weight for shark captures for awards during all club rallies and contests. For mako sharks, blue sharks and all other species the minimum weight shall be 60kg regardless of line class used for the capture. The club has also imposed a minimum weight for billfish captures for awards during all club rallies and contests. For marlin, swordfish and all other species the minimum weight shall be 60kg regardless of line class used for the capture.

The weighmaster will check and enforce these requirements.

No disputes will be entered into.

9. The minimum line class allowable for prizes in rallies is 1kg. Any line class from the approved G.F.A.A line class categories from 1kg, 2kg, 3kg, 4kg, 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg are eligible for club, T.G.F.A and G.F.A.A records.

G.F.A.A approved tippet classes for both fresh and saltwater fly fishing are 1kg, 2kg, 3kg, 4kg, 6kg, 8kg, 10kg. A tippet line class of 15kg may be used , but only for sharks and marlin.

10. Fishes captured throughout the season must be weighed by a weighmaster* using scales that are in current certification, and a weigh docket completed to make the capture eligible for awards.

11. Only fish Tagged and Released during Club Rallies , Contests and Sanctioned Tournaments shall count toward the following Perpetual Trophies, Ross Heddle Trophy, Shane Banks Trophy, Robin Banks Trophy, Malcolm Fitzpatrick Trophy.

12. The following acts will disqualify a tag and release : Failure to comply with G.F.A.A angling rules and equipment regulations or tournament tag and release rules, failure to comply with all other regulations that disqualify a capture : Use of a gaff is not permitted.

*weighmaster, weighing of fish as defined by the G.F.A.A journal. All captures shall be weighed by either a club weighmaster, a club recorder, or a club committee member.
